Writing a Compelling Introduction

General Requirements You Can Achieve with This Guideline:

- At least 3 sentences (optimally 4-5 sentences, including the thesis)
- An interesting "hook" to introduce the paper
- A thesis as the last sentence of the introduction

Steps to Writing a Good 4-Sentence Introduction:

Although you can write in order (first to last sentence), this method is going backwards *Prompt: Write an opinion paper about abortion.*

1. Compose your thesis first (refer to thesis composition materials for details).

Although many people support abortion because of a belief in "my body, my choice," a woman should not have an abortion because it takes an innocent life, results in psychological damage, and is unbiblical.

2. Write a sentence that leads into the thesis. Usually, this sentence starts with an "although" or "however," since it responds to the previous sentence. Tip: write the sentence plainly. Then just add "however/on the other hand/nevertheless," to the beginning of the sentence.

3. Write a sentence that states the "general" or "common" view. This sentence could include words like "usually," "tend(s) to," "on the surface," "assume(s)," etc. Tip: Just think of a "gut reaction" to the topic about which you are writing.

4. Write a sentence that "hooks" your reader. This sentence introduces your topic. You could use a shocking statistic or an interesting quote.

5. Once you have your sentences together, read them over and, if needed, **fix any repetitions**.
