Accreditation: The School of Music and Performing Arts achieved accreditation by the National Association of Schools of Music (NASM) in 1979. The program achieved associate membership in NASM in 1972. The curriculum adheres to NASM standards required for the Bachelor of Music degree.

Student Life: Situated just 25 minutes from Center City Philadelphia and 1.5 hours from New York City, Cairn offers easy access to cultural experiences like Broadway and the Philadelphia Orchestra. On campus, the University regularly hosts music seminars and masterclasses, and offers a range of ensemble opportunities for students to perform both locally within a close-knit community, as well as globally.

Music Facilities: The music facilities include a two-story building housing faculty studios, offices, classrooms, and rehearsal and practice rooms. Additionally, there is a music technology lab equipped with synthesizers and computers with music education and composition software. Performance venues include the 150-seat Lewis Holmes Recital Hall, the William Chatlos Auditorium, Manor Hall, and various pipe organs, electronic organs, and pianos.



In 2004, the University was designated an "All-Steinway School," signifying that approximately 90 percent of all pianos used are made by Steinway and Sons.

- Lead and plan School faculty meetings as part of the University's meeting schedule.
- Work with the Provost to prepare accreditation documents and site team visits.
- Collaborate with Marketing, and Admissions on recruitment and retention strategies.
- Serve as a liaison between the School and University educational resources and support services.
- Oversee support staff working in other departments concerning their support for the School.
