Improving Student Affordability

Your generosity has provided more students with the opportunity to pursue a biblical education, regardless of their ability to afford it.

Over 97% of our students receive financial aid because of the generous gifts made each year to The Cairn Fund. The Cairn Fund sustains long-established scholarships, like the music or need-based scholarships. But through the Forward campaign, we were also able to offer new ones. New scholarships for social work and biology were created, in addition to the New Horizons Scholarship Fund, which supports women who choose life.

In 2017, the University offered its first International Christian School Leadership Scholarships. To date, over 60 students have received this scholarship. Over the past four years, the University's undergraduate NRA (non-resident alien) student population has grown by 55%, and Cairn has continued to grow its support of those students, including the hiring of Dr. Guy and Carolyn Eshelman, our two missionaries in residence.

Expanding Academic Opportunities

Your generosity has expanded Cairn's reach through the addition of academic programs.

The second major goal of Forward was to launch new programs in science and technology. In 2017, the University launched majors in computer science, information systems, mathematics, and graphic design. The following year brought biology programs, including pre-med and pre-physical therapy. Those weren't the only new programs; in the past three years, we've launched 26 degree programs and even more minors and dual-level options.

These new programs brought the need for new classrooms, labs, and studios, so our campus has seen many additions since the launch of the campaign. In addition to the existing 3D art studio, there is now a 2D art studio and a Mac graphic design lab. Other new spaces include a model classroom for education majors, two science labs for biology and chemistry classes, and a computer science lab for students in the computer science and information systems programs.

Building Campus Community

Your generosity is improving and creating additional spaces for building community among our students, faculty, and alumni, as well as facilitating outreach to the local community.

The third and final major goal of Forward was to improve and create new spaces for student life and athletics. These spaces contribute to each student's experience at Cairn.

Since it opened in Fall 2018, The Highlands has been one of the best gathering places on campus. Students often enjoy their coffee outside in the courtyard, which received brand new furniture in 2019 as a gift from the Class of 1969.


In addition to these new spaces, we've also made improvements to existing ones. The Masland Library has undergone major renovations to improve our students' research and study experiences. In the past four years, they have also added over 483,300 new print and digital resources to their offerings to support student research.

One of the greatest projects funded by Forward is the G. Patrick Stillman Athletic Complex. Construction of the complex is scheduled to begin this spring and will be completed later this year. This new complex will create space for students to gather and athletes to compete.
